What is your role as an Associate Editor?

Associate Editors ensure a fair, rigorous and transparent peer review of 5-10 manuscripts per year (depending on your availability, the journal and your area of expertise). Please consult the Frontiers review guidelines for more information:

In the initial stages, Associate Editors:

1. Nominate 10-15 potential Review Editors - Review Editors (trusted reviewers and advisers) are the regular reviewers of manuscripts and are typically established researchers (clinicians, principal investigators, assistant professors, or exceptionally outstanding senior postdocs) whose expertise fall within the scope of the section. The Editorial Office will assist with sending the formal invitations on your behalf.
2. Co-edit/suggest a Research Topic (article collection) - To contribute to the editorial direction of the section, Associate Editors suggest/co-edit themed article collections (Research Topics) that are featured in the section annually.
